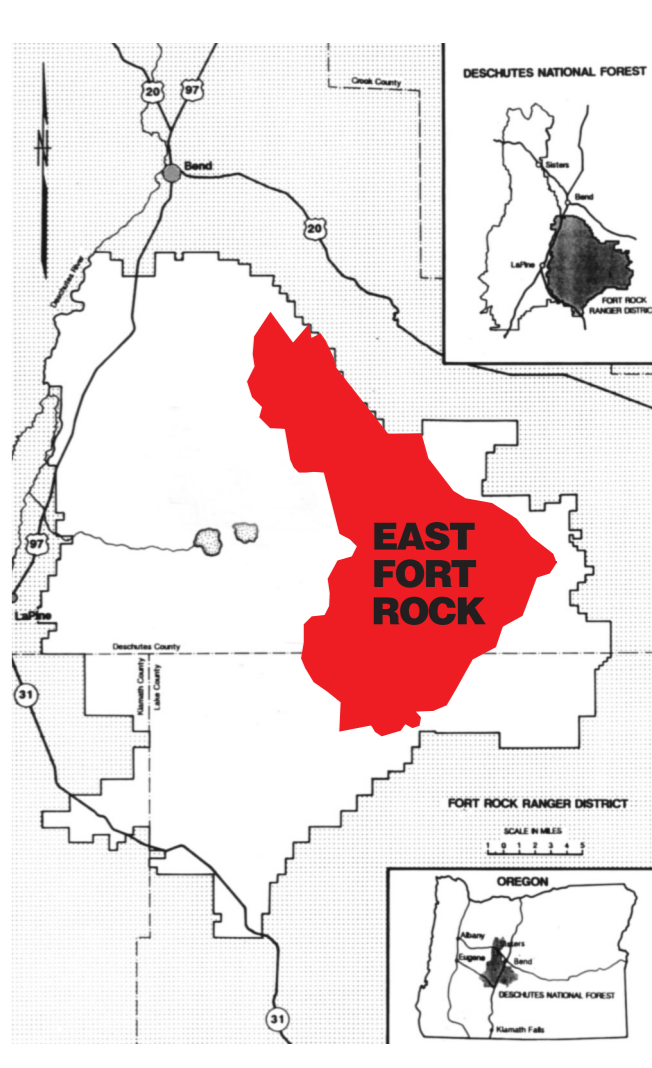
Chesley's Challenge

This challenging 53-mile route commemorates the vision and tenacity of George Chesley who was the Fort Rock District Ranger responsible for the creation of East Fort Rock in 1993. Like this route, there were many obstacles to overcome and it was not a quick nor easy task to implement the first designated, managed OHV trail system in Central Oregon. Because of his efforts, you have trails to ride today. Now, it's your responsibility to ensure that you have trails to ride tomorrow. Please Tread Lightly!

How To Get There

From Bend:
Follow Hwy. 20 east about 20 miles. After crossing the Horse Ridge Summit, turn right on the second road, paved Road 23. Proceed south for 5.5 miles until the road forks. Take paved Road 25 to the right and follow the signs to the Camp II Trailhead.

From LaPine:
Take the Finley Butte road (paved Road 22) east about 24 miles, and follow the signs to the South Lava Trailhead.
